
Kishu Bincho-tan × DAITO KASEI Create new value

"Minabe-Tanabe Ume System makes possible Sustainable Agriculture

In 2015, the "Minabe-Tanabe Ume System" agricultural method was registered at Globally Important Agricultural Heritage Systems (GIAHS), an initiative of the UN' Food and Agriculture Organization. Ubame oak, the raw material of Kishu Bincho-tan is the one of its system and it makes possible sustainable agriculture.



Charcoal made technology is continued from Edo period (17th-19th century) and it is designated as intangible folk cultural properties of Wakayama.

Kishu Bincho-tan is called white coal which is solid and good quality. Today, it is still made by misters' hand one by one.



We established \[DAITO KASEI- Forest of Smiles \] under "Kigyo no Mori" certification

For ten years, we will maintain an area of 2.53ha (30,000 square yards) by planting trees and trimming undergrowth. Our actions will contribute to the reduction of CO2 emissions and the protection of the forest. As such, we hope to contribute to the protection of the beautiful nature in Wakayama prefecture.
